

Senior Clinical Training Scholarships (Residencies)

Applications are invited for Senior Clinical Training Scholarships (residencies) in a variety of disciplines. These are three-year postgraduate programmes involving supervised clinical work and applied clinical research. Scholars will receive specialised training in the relevant discipline while working within the College's hospitals (or farms/referral facilities where relevant) and will be expected to prepare to sit the examination for membership of the relevant European or American specialty boards. Scholars will also be enrolled onto a Masters of Veterinary Medicine (MVetMed) programme. Scholars will be involved in clinical research and will be expected to submit for publication manuscripts based on their research work during the three-year programme.

Scholarships are open to veterinary graduates holding a degree registrable with the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons. The tax-free stipend for the Senior Scholarship will start at £16,902 per annum, increasing by annual increments to £18,222 and will be continued subject to satisfactory progress and assessment. Scholarships will commence on **Monday 4th July 2016 (this is not negotiable)**.

Clinical Training Scholarships (internships)

Applications are invited for Clinical Training Scholarships (internships) in a variety of disciplines. Scholarships are open to veterinary graduates holding a degree registrable with the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons.

Small animal clinical training scholars will receive advanced training and gain experience in the disciplines of internal medicine, soft tissue and orthopaedic surgery, anaesthesia, emergency and critical care, neurology and diagnostic imaging at the Queen Mother Hospital for Animals (Hertfordshire campus).

Production animal clinical training scholars will receive advanced training and gain experience including internal medicine and surgery, livestock health and production, theriogenology and veterinary public health. These will be based in the RVC Welsh Regional Veterinary Centre based in South Wales; the Farm Animal clinical activities based at RVC's Hertfordshire Campus; and a further scholar will be embedded in Synergy Farm Health in Dorset.

Equine clinical training scholars will receive advanced training and gain experience in the disciplines of equine surgery, internal medicine, anaesthesia and diagnostic imaging based in the Equine Referral Hospital (Hertfordshire campus).

Thirteen Small Animal scholarships, up to five Production Animal and three Equine scholarships will commence on Monday 27th June 2016 for a fixed term (54 weeks).

The tax-free stipend is £14,278 pa for 54 weeks. These scholarships count as a rotating internship for the Specialist European Colleges.
